Abstract: I will answer some of the questions I am most frequently asked about my "General Relativity" book: Why did I write the book? (This is a particularly good question, given that at the time there was already an excellent graduate text by Misner, Thorne, and Wheeler and an outstanding monograph on advanced topics by Hawking and Ellis.) How long did it take me to write it? What were my expectations of the role that the book would play and what surprised me the most about the reception of the book? Do I plan to write a second edition? (The answer to the last question is "no" but I'll say a few words of explanation as to why.)
